Staff Reports and Requests:

A. Manager's Report – Steve Forrester

Mr. Forester reported: Paving has started at the wetlands and construction of kiosks are getting ready to begin; Combs Flat Road bridge is in place with installation of utilities starting and is three (3) days ahead of schedule; we worked out an agreement with Contact Industries regarding a right of way encroachment; staff met with Anette Liebe from the Governors Regional Solutions office; we will have a City Academy on November 2nd that will cover city finances; the Planning Commission has approved land use applications that will lead to 150 additional dwelling options; the city and county is having an Oregon Government Ethics training class on the 13th; and the external auditors were here last week and the city had a clean audit.

B. Pavement Condition Index (PCI) Update – Eric Klann / Scott Smith

Eric Klann, Public Works Director and Scott Smith, Street Supervisor had a power point presentation on the latest PCI inspection performed on city streets. The power point highlighted the overall condition, number of centerline miles for city streets, value of street infrastructure, funds that would be necessary to maintain or improve the index for city streets, and comparisons of costs associated with various levels of maintaining in the future.

Discussions continued regarding this remaining consistent with the city strategic long term planning; and ODOT meetings that have highlighted an increase in traffic of 18% between Prineville and Redmond.
