## Common Violations

- Discarded trash, rubbish, and debris left in yards or on public property.
- Household garbage left out that creates a stench.
- Storage of **JUNK** outside or within a facility that is not wholly or entirely enclosed, and is visible from the street or a neighboring property.
- Vehicles parked on the street with flat tires or expired registration.
- Storage of unused, non-operative, unlicensed or abandoned vehicles on private or public property.
- Recreational vehicles, travel trailers, cargo trailers, boats, etc. parked on the street for longer than 72 hours. **ORD. 93.41, 93.56, 93.59, 153.092**

## DID YOU KNOW?

The fine for violating a City Ordinance may be up to **\$500 per occurrence**. The issuance of a fine does not relieve the duty to correct the violation.



- The term **JUNK** includes all inoperative vehicles, abandoned vehicles, unlicensed vehicles, old vehicle parts, old machinery, old machinery parts, old appliances or parts thereof, appliances that are not
- being used for the purpose they were manufactured for, discarded furniture, mattresses, carpeting, old iron or other metal, glass, paper or any other discarded material. **ORD. 93.56**
