This 120 acre wetland was designed as a wastewater utility system for the city of Prineville, but has quickly become one of the most visited recreational and wildlife refuge areas in Crook County.

Located 2.2 miles west of Prineville on O'Neil Hwy.
From town center: Head west on US-26 (3rd St).
Slight left on OR-126 W (signs for Redmond/Bend) and cross the bridge.
Turn right onto OR-370 W (O'Neil Hwy).
In 2.2 miles turn right onto Rimrock Acres Loop.
The Wetlands are the first left.
