

## ORDINANCE NO. 1232

### AN ORDINANCE ADOPTING THE PRINEVILLE/CROOK COUNTY AIRPORT MASTER PLAN UPDATE 2017

**WHEREAS**, the Prineville/Crook County Airport (“Airport”) was established in 1942 and has been serving Prineville and Crook County since that time; and

**WHEREAS**, the Airport is currently owned by Crook County (“County”) and managed by the City of Prineville (“City”) and serves a variety of aviation interests including recreational and business general aviation, flight training, and emergency response; and

**WHEREAS**, the City and the County completed an Airport lay out plan report in 2003. Since that time numerous changes have occurred in the aviation, at the Airport and in the region; and

**WHEREAS**, the Federal Aviation Administration (“FAA”) recommends that master plans be prepared every eight to ten years in order to ensure that airports meet current design standards. The FAA also uses the master plan as a tool to determine eligibility for FAA funding of capital projects airports; and

**WHEREAS**, the City contracted with WH Pacific, Inc., to prepare a master plan update for the Airport; and

**WHEREAS**, City sought extensive public involvement during the master plan update including a planning advisory committee representing a cross section of the community and representatives from the Oregon Department of Aviation and the FAA; and

**WHEREAS**, during the Airport master planning process a series of four public meetings were held to seek input from the public at large and to discuss a variety of Airport issues, study progress, key findings and development concepts; and

**WHEREAS**, the City Council and County Court held a joint meeting on September 26, 2017 to receive comments on the Airport master plan update.

Now, therefore, the people of the City of Prineville ordain as follows:

1. The master plan update for Prineville/Crook County Airport dated August 2017 (“Master Plan”) attached hereto as Exhibit A including all appendices is hereby adopted.
2. The zoning of lands within the Airport boundary as shown in the land use plan sheet number 12 in chapter 8 of the Master Plan is hereby adopted as the zones set forth on such land use plan and zoning map.
